- Increasing wage subsidy from 10% to a maximum 75%
- Launch of Small/Medium Business Enterprise Loan and Guarantee Program. Up to \$40,000.00 in interest free, government backed loans with possible as much as \$10,000.00 forgivable to "qualifying SME's"
- Deferral on regular GST/HST payments until June
- Creation of Canada Emergency Business Account
